Rebecca Blakiston is the user experience (UX) librarian and strategist at the University of Arizona Libraries, where she promotes UX as a strategy to increase our effectiveness and broaden our impact. She consults on UX methods and coordinates user research to help make informed, thoughtful decisions to improve the student and faculty experience. Her favorite things these days include user interviews, usability testing, persona development, empathy mapping, and inclusive design.

Rebecca has written, presented, and taught extensively on user research, content strategy, design thinking, and writing for the user experience. Since 2018, she has been editor-in-chief of *Weave: Journal of Library User Experience*.
