# Background

January 2021 - begin planning first Blind Date with a Book pilot for February

Major issue: lack of students, staff, and faculty on campus, very little traffic in library space

Solution: create online request form and play matchmaker



## Form Creation

#### Considerations:

- Patrons choose from pre-selected set of books or give input type of book they want
- Include ebooks or physical books or both
- How to send notifications or get patrons to pick up books

#### Decisions:

- Patrons give input on type of book
- Include both ebooks and physical books
- Send emails with ebook or pick up information

# Form Options

#### Section 1

- Do you want some say in the book?
  - Yes, give me options
  - No, surprise me
- Format
  - Physical book
  - Ebook

#### Section 2

- Fiction, nonfiction, or poetry
- Fiction genres
- Nonfiction subjects
- Length
- Author identity preference
- Topics to avoid

# **Evolution of Program**

#### December 2021

Launched Holi-Date with a Book

#### February 2022

- Added physical display
- Added audiobook option b/c subscription to Overdrive
- Moved away from Proquest and EBSCOhost ebook databases


#### December 2024

Removed book length option







### Lessons Learned

- Create email templates for notifications
- Be prepared for influx of requests after emailing campus email lists
- Pull about 60% 70% fiction vs. 30% 40% nonfiction
- Pull physical requests from displayed books
- Give expiration date to pick up physical books
- Use collection filters in Overdrive to find matches
- Patrons appreciate way to connect with academic library beyond instruction & research
