





Number of checkouts




Checkouts based on item location


Transactions by Hour



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Checkout by Patron Type




Projects

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Patron-Initiated Circulation (PCIRC)





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
Collections Assessment & Stacks Management

Number of Items Shelved

To get an idea of how many items have been shelved in the general collection we combined the number of new titles added to the collection and the number of items checked in. To get the number of new titles we limited items in the general collection by item creation date.

Number of new items: 15,652 Number of check-ins: 66,507 Total items shelved: 82,159

Shelf Space in Use



The above graph shows the number of linear inches of shelf space occupied by collection materials. Given the measurements above, 66% of available shelf space is occupied by collection materials.

Completed

Government Documents Microform Shifting Project: -Government Documents microform was relocated -The relocation project required extensive shifting and reorganization

Bedbug Response:

-Staff processed 3399 items from 4 different areas of the general collection -All items were removed from shelves and placed into sealed plastic bags -Heat treatment was applied to all items -All items were re-shelved

Center for International Collections Project:

-The CIC collection required shifting after a significant amount of books were damaged and to accommodate new items that were being stored inaccessibly due to inadequate shelf space in required areas.

-The Center for International Collections has almost 45000 items and almost every item was touched for this shifting project

-Length of time: I-2 months with 3 student employees

Children's Collection Shifting Project

-671 new titles added during this fiscal year requiring shifting in the collection

I-19 Folded Maps:

-Created a list of all I-19 maps -Checked for electronic overlap -Sent list to fedgovdocs listserv for 30 days before withdrawal

Assisted with AssureVault Transfer:

-About 3045 items from the general collection and CIC collection were identified and pulled for off site storage -Used 6th floor swing space as temporary storage -Boxed all items for shipment -205 boxes total

Magazine & Newspaper Microfilm Duplication Project: -Compare microfilm and electronic overlap -About 1200 magazine titles -About 660 newspaper titles

Electronic Resource Duplication Project -Examining newly-purchased electronic resources for microform duplication
